### **Telstra**

HWCV has a preference for an Indigenous artist to do a mural. It was pointed out that the Moona Moona Creek toilet block cost \$5000.

It was also acknowledged that it is not a simple surface to paint on, and other things need to be done e.g. the window needs to be fixed.

Alternative artist could be Clayton Campion.

Penny to contact Jerrinja Local Aboriginal Land Council to ask if they would like to do the artwork, and if interested to give a quote on cost; noting that there is no guarantee the work will go ahead.

## 8. Huskisson Heritage Association – Jo Warren:

Association was registered on 13 June 2019. As of today have 106 paid members, people joining with lots of skills such as town planning, legal expertise and so forth. Aim is to ensure the preservation of Huskisson heritage.

The driver to establish the association was the Anglican Church site where DA action has started. The older church building and shed have been demolished. There are regular gatherings on site to protest; now being held on Thursday mornings 9.30 until lunch outside the church.

The DA to remove the old church building spoke at length about the asbestos, but during demolition workers were not using protective clothing. HHA asked Work Cover to look at the site; Work Cover verbally reported that there wasn't any asbestos. However, a few days later workers were dressed in

protective gear and wrapping material (that had been laying on the ground) in plastic. HHA is concerned that the DA process has not been followed.

Note the DA does not included removing any vegetation, or building new piers. Both these actions seem to be required for the church to be moved.

HHA has been holding ongoing peaceful and legal protests, police have come and confirmed that it is not an illegal action

A meeting will be held at 6pm 27<sup>th</sup> August in the Huskisson Community Centre.
